BUDGET

Our current account has \$892.00 as of May 31.

CPCU deposits \$5.00 into our account for every attendee. Members do not have to belong to CPCU for this added benefit.

The cost to join Capitaliers is \$5.00 per person. Dues are good from 1/1 to 12/31 of each year, no matter when you join.

50/50 drawing was held. This month's winner was Anita Rios. \$42.50 went to the new Hope Rescue and \$42.50 to Anita. Congratulations.

NEW BUSINESS

During Lunch Dave and Marie visited from CPCU to provide updates. Federal Reserve Meeting on 6/14. Anticipate a ½ percent increase in interest rate. Lansing CPCU office is NOT closing, this is a rumor. A merger taking place. CPCU welcomes a Saginaw Credit Union to the family. After merge CPCU will be in the 140 million range. The merge is taking place at the end of the month. The system may be down July 1 to combine. We should see no changes to how we log in or access online. There are no changes to existing CPCU processes. Offices in Lansing, Battle Creek, Eaton Rapids and Saginaw. With the new merge comes two new offerings: Diamond Money Fund. This is a change for the better. Previously it was a minimum of \$5000, will now be \$2500. Also ACH on demand. Ability for members to go in their account and deposit sooner so you have access to your dollars if needed. There is a fee. This was something Saginaw offered so CPCU will now offer as an added benefit. New offering with CDS. CPCU is offering an 11-month CE at 5%APR. Minimum of \$1000 with a quarterly dividend. Dave is still contemplating retirement on 12/31/23.

Scholarships open to children and grandchildren of retirees. This year seven \$1000 and two \$800 scholarships are being awarded.
